

- 410. **Lillehammer 1994 Winter Official Results.** 402 pages, 22.9x22.5cm (9"x8.9"), in Norwegian, English and French. Results noted for all participants in all events. EF. **(\$100)**
- 411. **The 12th Asian Games in Hiroshima, 1994.** Gilt, silvered and bronze medals, 60mm. Logo. Rev. View of Hiroshima and legend. In blue velvet case, EF. (\$100)

#### ATLANTA, 26th OLYMPIC GAMES, 1996

- 412. Official Torch of the Atlanta 1996 Olympic Games. Aluminum and Georgia pecan wood, 80cm (31.5"), designed by Peter Mastrogiannis. 22 reeds represent the cities where Olympic Games had been held since 1896. Gathered by 2 goldplated brass bands, the top band displays the Atlanta torch logo and the quilt of leaves design, the bottom band lists all Olympic cities since 1896. The pecan wooden handle represents the connection of the flame between heaven and earth. The flame was lit in Olympia. It reached Los Angeles on April 27 and ended 84 days later in Atlanta, carried by 10,000 relay runners, horses, bicycles, trains, ships, and hydroplanes. EF. (\$2,400)
- 413. **Paralympic Games Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 82mm (3.2"). Paralympic Atlanta 1996 logo and legend. Rev. Braille legend over Paralympic logo. Looped, with blue ribbon. In green cardboard presentation box. EF. (\$3,500)

- 414. Small Size Rome 1960 Silver Torch Presented to Italian Gold Medal Winners in Atlanta 1996 by the Italian NOC. Cast silver, hallmarked "800", 27.5cm (10.8"), by Paolillo Co., Rome. Numbered. EF, in wooden, velvet-lined presentation case, with dedication plaque. Rare. EF. (\$2,600)
- 415. Heli Rantanen, Finland, Gold Medal Winner in Javelin Throw. Made by Terinit Sportswear Finland, medium size. Embroidered Finnish logo on front, very large on back. "Heli Rantanen was the seventh Finnish javelin thrower to win a gold medal, but the first woman." (David Wallechinsky). With color photo, 9x13cm (3.5"x5.21" wearing this jacket). EF. (\$200)
- 416. Group of 4 Atlanta Commemorative Zippo Lighters. Gold colored, silver plated, and 2 with gold logo. Plus Centennial Olympic Games Opening Ceremony Bag for Visitors including opening ceremony program, lighter, pin, scarf etc. All EF. (\$120)
- 416a. U.S. Olympic Athletics Team 1996 Beer Stein with Pewter Top. Multicolor ceramic, 22cm (8.7") high, handcrafted by Ceramarte, Brazil for Anheuser Busch, Inc. Olympic sprinter, hurdler and discus thrower in raised design, "1996 U.S. Olympic Team Atlanta" below. With pewter top showing stadium and flame. EF. (\$100)



- 417. All Aboard to Atlanta! Train with Ten Colorful Count-Down Train Cars Holding 1000 Days to 100 Days Official Pins. Frame 102x18.5cm (40.2"x7.3"), Commemorative Trading Pin Set by Imprinted Products Corporation. Train Reminds of the Pin Fever that grapped Atlanta before the 1996 Olympic Games. EF (\$100)
- 418. **Sports Illustrated Olympic Daily, Day 1 to 6 and Days 11 and 14, 1996.** 21x26.5cm (8.3"x10.4"), 40 illustrated pages each. Plus the **Closing Program, August 4, 1996.** 32 + 4 pages, 25x33cm (9.8"x13"). Almost all EF. (9 pcs.) **(\$80)**

## NAGANO, 18th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1998

- 419. Official Torch of the Nagano 1998 Winter Olympic Game. Aluminum, partially gilt, 55cm (21.7"). Designed after ancient Japanese torches called Taimatsu, it shows the Nagano emblem. A brightly colored orange cord wrapped around the lower part forms the grip. Fueled with clean burning propane, it burnt for about 20 minutes. The torch relay in Japan took place from January 6 until February 7, when the Olympic fire was lit during the opening ceremony. Choice EF. (\$5,500)
- 420. **Participation Medal.** Bronze, 60mm. Nagano logo over legend. Rev. Wooded mountainside. EF, in presentation box. **(\$240)**
- 421. **Swiss Team Medal.** Silvered, partially enameled in color, 56x56mm. Color logo over U.S. and Swiss shields. Rev. "altogether for success! thank you". EF, cased. **(\$100)**

- 422. British Olympic Team Sweatsuit. Red, white and blue cotton/polyester, large size, made by Adidas. Large Great Britain Olympic team logo on front. Blue sweatpants with embroidered Olympic team logo. EF. (2 pcs.) (\$100)
- 422a. Mallon, Bill. The 1896 to 1920 Olympic Games Results for All Competitors in All Events, with Commentary. Series of 7 Books, 1896 and 1912 with Ture Widlund, 1908 with Jan Buchanan, and 1920 with Anthony Th. Bijkerk. Blue linen, each 18x26cm (7.1"x10.2"), published by McFarland & Co. All EF. (7 vols.) (\$140)

## SYDNEY, 27th OLYMPIC GAMES, 2000

- 423. Official Torch of the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games. Three layers consisting of polished stainless steel, anodized aluminum and coated aluminum, 77cm (30.5"), designed by Blue Sky Design, Sydney, manufactured by G.A. & L. Harrington. The three layers represent earth, fire and water. EF. (\$3,000)
- 424. Official Commemorative Torch in Original Wooden, Glazed Wall Case. Officially sanctioned by the IOC to be sold in a limited number to the public. Center part opens to show burning unit inside. Mounted on wood with descriptive background, 53x86cm (21"x34"). EF. (\$1.800)
- 425. **Participation Medal.** Silvered, 50mm. Sydney Olympic logo. Rev. 3-line legend over Olympic rings. EF, in original box. (\$260)

- 426. **Australia's Olympic History Plate from 1896 to 2000.** Colorful ceramic, 27cm (10.6"), made by Strictly. Torch with map of Australia and Olympic rings surrounded by 24 flags of Olympic countries, 1896 to 2000. EF. **(\$80)**
- 427. **Trio of Ancient Greek Athletes Porcelain Plates of the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.** Orange and black, 20cm (7.9") each, made by famous Wedgwood Company. Scene of 34 runners; a discus thrower and Sydney logo encircled by 15 ancient Greek runners. All EF. (3 pcs.) (\$150)
- 428. Blue and White Commemorative Wedgwood Plate of the XXVIIth Olympic Games in Sydney 2000. 21.5cm (8.5"). Sydney logo surrounded by 9 different sports depictions, in olive leaf wreath. EF. (\$100)

## SALT LAKE CITY, 19th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2002

429. **Official Torch.** Silver colored metal and glass, 83.8cm (33"). Shaped like a fiery icicle in motion, the polished silver colored bottom bears the motto "Light the fire within"; center metal, and glass top section in "frozen flame" texture with logo on metal part. EF. (\$3,250)

- 430. Rosa Serra, Sculptor. Merci. Thank You. President Juan A. Samaranch's Farewell Gift to IOC Members at the End of His Presidency in 2002. Bronze sculpture, 23.2cm (9.1"), 11cm (4.3") high, by Rosa Serra, Catalonia/Spain. Two columns with the Summer (1.) and Winter Olympic Games (r.) in gold when Samaranch was President of the IOC: from Sarajevo 1984 to Sydney 2000. In the center are the Olympic rings above "Merci. Thank You", an 11cm high, 3-dimensionsal torso, a favorite subject of Serra, at the top. The base, 10.9x3.9x3cm, displays a gold facsimile signature of Juan A. Samaranch. The reverse is inscribed with the sculptor's name in gold "rosa.serra." Rosa Serra, the famous Spanish sculptor, was a friend of President Samaranch, and he asked her to create sculptures representing the different Olympic sports, an area she had not explored previously. She became renowned for her sport sculptures, being praised for having force and motion. President Samaranch asked her to create this rare farewell gift. EF. (\$2,400)
- 431. **Training Suit of Biathlon Gold and Silver Winner Uschi Diesel.**Jacket and pants of Biathlon Relay and Sprint, made by Adidas. With photo, 8.9x13cm (3.5"x5.1"). *Between 1992 and 2006 Diesel won 2 gold, 4 silver and 3 bronze medals.* EF. **(\$400)**
- 432. Tall Salt Lake City 2002 Commemorative Beer Stein. 58cm (23") tall, made by King of Germany for Anheuser-Busch. Four flaming torches divide four handpainted panels: athletes marching with logo flag; view of Salt Lake City; list of Olympic Winter Games since 1924 Chamonix; and Arches National Park in Utah. Gold pictograms at top and bottom. With decorated pewter top and 10 gold logos. EF. (\$240)
- 432a. **Swiss Team Medal.** Silvered, partially enameled in color, 56x56mm. Color logo over Australian and Swiss shields. Rev. "With Thanks For Your Cooperation". EF, cased. **(\$100)**



- 433. Official Torch of the Athens 2004 Olympic Games. Silver colored metal and olive wood, 68cm (26.8") long. The torch resembles an olive leaf, and the design wants to express "Pan Metron Ariston" (All things in moderation, translated from Greek). A simple and beautiful design. EF. (\$2,200)
- 434. **Set of White Torchbearer Suit, Socks and Headband.** Cotton, large size. Top displays the olive wreath logo. Unused. (\$100)
- 435. Participation Diploma. Multicolor, 21x29.5cm (8.3"x11.6"). Signatures of IOC President J. Rogge and Athens 2004 Organizing Committee President G. Angelopoulos. EF. (\$80)
- 436. Opening Ceremony Programs of Athens 2004 (August 13) and Torino 2006 (February 10) Olympic Games. Athens 87 pages, 21.1x33.7cm (8.3"x13.3"), in English, Greek and French; Torino 62 pages, 27.7x27.4cm (10.9"x10.8"), in Italian, English and French. Both Illustrated in color. Both EF. (2 pcs.) (\$100)
- 437. **Bid Book Athens 2004.** A blue leatherette case contains the bid book, a Fact Sheets brochure, an "Athens 2004" Video, a press release disk, Music, a bid button and a pen. Sides of the case lose. Contents EF. (\$150)

### **TORINO, 20th OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 2006**

- 438. Official Torch of the 2006 Olympic Winter Games in Torino, Italy. Blue techno-polymer-coated aluminum, 77cm (30.3") long, made by Pininfarina. The fire was lit in Olympia on November 27, 2005 and arrived in Rome on December 8. Until February 10 the torch traveled over 11,300 km across Italy, also France, Switzerland and Slovenia. Unused. EF. (\$1.800)
- 439. Cased Silver Participation Medal for Athletes. Silvered bronze, 39mm. Logo. Rev. Olympic rings over motto. With circular cardboard, within clear round plastic case. EF. (\$240)

- 440. **Cased Bronze Participation Medal for Officials.** Bronze, 39mm. Rev. Olympic rings over motto. With circular cardboard, within clear round plastic case. EF. **(\$160)**
- 441. **Neve and Glitz Mascots.** Blue and red/white plush, each 15cm (5.9") high. EF. **(\$80)**
- 442. (Book) The Journey of the Torino Olympic Flame Ancient Olympia to Panathenian Stadium, Athens, Nov. 27 Dec. 6, 2005. 83 unnumbered pages, illustrated in color, 32x32cm (12.6"x12.6"), in Greek and English. Greek dignitaries and Greek medal winners carried the flame to Athens. Illustrated boards with dust jacket. EF. (\$100)
- 443. Helsinki XX Olympic Winter Games 2006 Candidature File. Three volumes, 21.2x29.5cm (8.4"x11.6"), in English and French. EF. (\$100)

## **BEIJING, 29th OLYMPIC GAMES, 2008**

444. **Official Torch.** Red and anodized aluminum, 72cm (18.4"). Curved form in the shape of a paper scroll, with lucky clouds graphic expressing harmony. The torch relay started in Olympia, Greece, on March 24, traveled to over 100 cities on five continents and all of China, a distance of 137,000km. EF. (\$5,000)
