- Paris 1900. Second Place Silver Winner's Medal Awarded for Shooting. Silvered bronze, 41x59mm, by Fréderic de Vernon. Winged goddess scattering laurel branches over Paris exposition grounds. Rev. Victorious athlete standing on podium inscribed "CONCOURS DE TIR/VII CONCOURS/NATIONAL". Translated: Shooting Competition and VII National Shooting Competition. Toned EF. (\$800)
- 3. **St. Louis 1904. Bronze Winner's Medal Awarded for Two Miles Run** in the Western AAU Championship Meeting on July 30, 1904, to Jack E. Cannon. Bronze, 32mm, made by Mermod & Jacard. Olive branch between legend. Rev. "Two Miles Run". Suspended from mural crown inscribed "1904/Universal Exposition/Olympic Games/St. Louis". *All athletic events in St. Louis were Olympic events: Mallon, The 1904 Olympic Games, page 89.* Toned EF. **(\$2,600)**
- 4. **Stockholm 1912. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal.** Silver, 33mm, by Erik Lindberg and Bertram MacKennal, struck by Sporrong & Co. Herald proclaiming Olympic Games, bust of Ling, father of Swedish Gymnastics, on pedestal at r. Rev. Victorious athlete being crowned by two seated females. Lt. rubbing on high points, EF. **(\$5,000)**
- Antwerp 1920. Gold First Place Winner's Medal. Goldplated silver, 60mm by Josue Dupon. Victorious athlete holding palm branch and laurel wreath, Fame behind on left blowing horn, "VII Olympiade" legend. Rev. Brabo fountain with Antwerp city shield and view of port, City of Antwerp in background. Faint gold plating, EF. (\$6,500)
- Antwerp 1920. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 60mm, by Josue Dupon. Nude victorious athlete with palm branch and laurel wreath, fame blowing horn. Rev. Brabo Fountain, view of port of Antwerp and Cathedral in background. Toned EF. (\$6,000)

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- 7. Antwerp 1920. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal. Bronze, 60mm, by Josue Dupon. Victorious athlete holding palm branch and laurel wreath, Fame behind on left blowing horn. "VII Olympiade" legend. Rev. View of Port, Brabo fountain with Antwerp city shield, City of Antwerp in background. Toned EF. (\$5,000)
- Chamonix 1924 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal. Bronze, 55mm, by Raoul Benard. Victorious athlete holding skates and skis, Alps in background. Rev. French legend in 14 lines. A rare winner's medal from the First Olympic Winter Games. Toned EF. (\$9,000)
- St. Moritz 1928. Gold First Place Winner's Medal. 50mm, by Arnold Hünerwadel. Skater with outstretched arms surrounded by ice crystals. Rev. 5-line French legend between olive branches, rings above. Toned EF. (\$8,000)

- 10. Amsterdam 1928. Gold First Place Winner's Medal. Goldplated silver, 55mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli, struck by the Dutch State Mint in Utrecht. Seated Victory holding laurel wreath and palm branch, Colosseum Stadium in Rome at right background. Rev. Winner with palm branch being carried on shoulders of his jubilant teammates. Only 110 gold medals were awarded in Amsterdam plus 9 gold medals for the Art Competition. Housed in its round red VF cardboard box inscribed on top in gold "IXe Olympiade/Amsterdam/1928". Medal toned EF. (\$8,000)
- 11. Amsterdam 1928. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal. Bronze, 55mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli. Victory holding laurel wreath and palm branch, Colosseum Stadium in Rome at right background. Rev. Winner with palm branch being carried on shoulders of his jubilant teammates. The IOC held a competition in 1924 for a permanent winner's medal design, and this design was shown for the first time in Amsterdam 1928. The design stayed the same through Mexico 1968. Toned EF. (\$6,000)
- 12. **Los Angeles 1932. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.** Bronze, 55mm, by Giuseppe Cassioli, struck by Whitehead & Hoag. Victory with palm branch and laurel wreath seated at left, Coliseum in background at right. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant team members. Toned EF. **(\$6,000)**















13. **St. Moritz 1948 Winter. Bronze Third Place Winner's Medal.**Bronze, 60mm, by Huguenin. Hand holding torch in raised design, Olympic rings and snowflakes in background, Olympic motto, "Citius Altius Fortius" around top. Rev. Four-line French legend "Vmes Jeux Olympiques d' Hiver St. Moritz 1948" between ice crystals. The St. Moritz Games were the first Olympic Games held after the end of World War II, awarded only in September 1946. 26 nations and 878 athletes participated, and the Soviet Union sent a delegation of 10 to watch the games – they participated for the first time in Oslo 1952. Medal is toned EF. (\$5,000)



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- 14. **Tokyo 1964.** Athletics Silver Second Place Winner's Medal. Silver, 63mm, designed by Toshikaka Koshiba after Giuseppe Cassioli (1928). Seated Victory holding palm branch and laurel wreath, Rome's Colosseum stadium at right, award text at top right. Rev. Winner carried by jubilant teammates. The medal was struck by the Japanese Mint as a trial medal, 2mm thick, before deciding on the final strike. Small rim bumps on reverse, o.w. toned EF. (\$4,000)
- 15. Montreal 1976. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Housed in its Presentation Case. Silver, 60mm, obverse by Giuseppe Cassioli, struck by the Royal Canadian Mint in Ottawa. Seated Victory holding palm branch and laurel wreath, Rome's Colosseum Stadium at right, 4-line Montreal text at upper right. Rev. Small Montreal logo at top of open laurel wreath. With silver chain, housed in its wooden case and black leather cover with silver Montreal logo. EF. (\$26,000)
- 16. Calgary 1988. Gold Winner's Medal Presented in Official Display Case. Goldplated, 69mm, made by Jostens. Joint heads 1. of laureated athlete and Native American Indian with feather headdress made of winter sport equipment. Rev. Calgary logo within legend, "SAMPLE" on either side. With ribbon, in wood and glass display case with plaque on top. Base 18.2x8.1cm (7.2"x3.2"), 18cm (7.2") tall. EF. (\$1,500)

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- 17. Albertville 1992 Winter. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Housed in its Case. Silver and Lalique crystal, 92mm, 9mm thick. The crystal shows large Olympic rings over Alpine mountains, set in a silver border which is engraved with logo and olive branch, "Albertville 92" legend at bottom. With silver ribbon displaying Olympic color stripes in center. Housed in gray leatherette case lined in gray velvet, logo on top. EF. (\$15,000)
- 18. **Barcelona 1992. Bronze Winner's Medal with Ribbon.** Bronze, 70mm, by Xavier Corbero, struck by Madrid Mint. Victory seated with palm branch, laurel branch on left, legend and Olympic rings on right. Rev. Barcelona 1992 Olympic logo. With ribbon in five Olympic colors. EF. (\$5,000)
- 19. Sydney 2000. Silver Second Place Winner's Medal Awarded for Women's Lightweight Judo, 57kg. Silver, 68mm (2.7"). Female seated above Rome Stadium holding laurel wreath and palm branch. Rev. Cauldron and Sydney torch, Olympic rings above circular award legend. With blue inscribed ribbon. EF. (\$9,000)

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20. Athens 2004. Silver Second Place Paralympic Winner's Medal. Silver, 60mm. View of the Acropolis in Athens. Rev. Paralympic logo above Braille legend. With multicolor ribbon. *Many Paralympic winner's medals in 2004 were not inscribed with the name of the winner.* EF. (\$3,000)

Beijing 2008 logo in center surrounded by ring of jade, "Baseball" inscribed on outer circle. The team from Cuba won second place, Korea winning first. Baseball was voted out of the 2012 Olympic Games in 2005, the first sport deleted since 1936 when Polo was voted out. Polo returned again with the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. PARIS 2ND OLYMPIC GAMES, 1900

The 1900 Paris Olympic Games were held in conjunction with the World's Exposition. They played only a minor role. There were athletes who didn't know that the events they participated in were Olympic Games events. Few items relate directly to the Games. For this reason, we are also offering items commemorating the World Exposition.

ST. LOUIS, 3rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 1904

The 1904 Olympic Games in St. Louis were also held in conjunction with a World's Fair. This, again, detracted a lot from the importance of the Games. Few items are available that relate directly to the Olympiad, and they usually command very high prices. For this reason, we are also offering some memorabilia from the World's Fair which celebrated the Centennial of the Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803.

- 30. St. Louis 1904. Universal Congress of Lawyers and Jurists. Silverplated, 39x39mm, by Whitehead and Hoag, New York. Rising sun behind bust of Peace, between legend. Suspended from inscribed silver bar and dark violet ribbon. EF. (\$200)
- 31. Grand Prize Medal of the St. Louis Universal Exposition, 1904. Bronze, 65x73mm, by Adolph Weinmann. Louisiana cloaking Indian maiden. Rev. Eagle with outspread wings on panel with award legend. Toned EF. (\$140)
- 32. Commemorative Medal of the St. Louis Universal Exposition, 1904. Bronze, 70x70mm, by Adolph Weinmann. Louisiana cloaking Indian maiden. Rev. Eagle with outspread wings on panel with award legend. Toned EF. (\$140)

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

54. **Ninth IOC Congress in Berlin, 1930. Official Medal.** Cast bronze, 95x88mm, by Richard Klein. Large Olympic rings over globe surrounded by Olympic Motto. Rev. Brandenburg Gate of Berlin in center surrounded by "International Olympic Congress – Berlin 1930". Berlin presented the bid to hold the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin. Toned EF. (\$240)

LAKE PLACID, 3rd OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, 1932

- 55. Lake Placid 1932 Winter Participation Medal. Bronze, 48x60mm, by Julio Kilenyi. Winged figure of Fame blowing horn, Olympic rings above, winter landscape in background. Rev. Six winter sports depicted on shields around legend in six lines, scenes of curling and dogsledding below. EF. (\$5,000)
- 56. Lake Placid 1932 Winter. First Place Winner's Diploma Awarded to Johan Gröttumsbraaten of Norway for Skiing-Combined Event 18km Ski Race and Jumping. 35.5x25.2cm (14"x10"), by American Bank Note Co. Ltd. Award legend between winner's medal, light green outlines of participation medal behind text. Signed in ink by OC President G. Dewey and IOC President Baillet-Latour. 

PARIS, 33rd OLYMPIC GAMES, 2024

The torch was designed by Mathieu Lehanneur who drew inspiration from the 3 themes of the Paris Games: Equality, Water and Peacefulness. The torch relay started in Olympia on April 16, and ended on July 26, after the opening ceremony of the Paris Games on the Seine, with the lighting of the cauldron, a balloon, in the Tuileries.
